Informational Board briefing.

The presentation will provide an overview of the case management model known as Functional Family Probation Services (FFPS). This model is being implemented in the Juvenile Services Division to improve recidivism rates for juvenile offenders and increase our engagement with families. The Multnomah County Board members had requested additional information on FFPS during DCJ's recent budget work session.
- 3. Explain the fiscal impact (current year and ongoing).**
DCJ is currently providing training funds to implement FFPS in the Juvenile Services Division. The model may impact the management of span of control in future years. The model also requires an increased community presence and a more mobile workforce.
- 4. Explain any legal and/or policy issues involved.**

The session describes the implementation of a new case management model that may require future policy changes as implementation continues. FFPS does raise new safety concerns for Juvenile Court Counselors due to the significant increase in the frequency of home and community based visits.
