General Information

1. What action are you requesting from the Board?

The Department of Community Justice (DCJ) requests the approval to apply for the U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ), Office of Justice Programs (OJP), Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA), Adult Drug Court Discretionary Grant Program, FY2012 Competitive Grant in the amount of \$200,000.

2. Please provide sufficient background information for the Board and the public to understand this issue. Please note which Program Offer this action affects and how it impacts the results.

The purpose of this grant would allow access to a continuum of alcohol, drug, and other related treatment and rehabilitation services. Currently, DCJ pays for up to three Drug Court participants to be in a licensed residential treatment program each day. Drug Court participants are not given priority for these beds, so they are on a waiting list with up to a hundred other Multnomah County residents in anticipation of a residential bed. Residential treatment funding was not part of the original START Court grant. Over the past year, there has been from six to twelve START Court participants in residential treatment at any one time, far exceeding the three per day anticipated.

The Enhancements would allow the START Court to expand services to participant's which correlate with the following Strategic Plan areas:

1. Behavior Change: We will work with adult offenders and youth to reduce delinquent and criminal behavior:
 - √ Administer cognitive behavioral interventions and treatment as needed.
2. Accountability: We will hold adult offenders and youth accountable for their actions:
 - √ Utilize effective sanctions and interventions.
3. Resource Management: We will direct our resources to delivering cost-effective services:
 - √ Provide adequate resources to achieve or maintain effectiveness.
4. System Change: We will use advocacy and innovation to guide our work with stakeholders to improve community safety and assure a fair and just system:
 - √ Engage in partnerships that enhance public safety, create a sense of justice and reduce delinquency and recidivism.

3. Explain the fiscal impact (current year and ongoing).

DCJ is requesting \$200,000 to be spent from October, 2012 to September 30, 2014 and will include Central and Departmental indirect expenses.

4. Explain any legal and/or policy issues involved.

The grantee (DCJ) shall meet all grant requirements and must comply with the provisions in the Federal Financial Guide, found at www.grants.gov. Comply will all federal, state, and local laws and regulations governing services purchased through this solicitation.

5. Explain any citizen and/or other government participation that has or will take place.

DCJ will work with the state courts and community based providers for treatment and supervision coordination and collaboration to provide services to START Court, District Attorney, Defense teams, treatment providers and START Court participants.

The enhancement would add 2.5 residential treatment beds. DCJ will formulate outcome measures to meet the objectives of the grant and to report progress to stakeholders. There is a 25% match requirement, (66,667 for \$200,000 in funding).

The grant amount is \$200,000 for 24 months. This includes 2.5 residential treatment beds @ 120 per

day over 24 months.

The filing deadline is March 8th, 2012.

October, 2012 to September 30, 2014.
- **When the grant expires, what are funding plans?**
DCJ will continue to seek funding for these services from future government grants and
