<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Adapt-a-Home</li> </ul>	Housing Rehab Program that removes architectural barriers to create accessible housing for low-income people with physical disabilities.	\$55,600
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Mend-a-Home</li> </ul>	Provides critical home repairs for low-income homeowners that includes environmental hazards i.e. lead based paint, mold, etc., plumbing, roofs, electrical.	\$63,075
<b>Public Facilities &amp; Improvements - 1 Application</b>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Pedestrian Access Development – NE 230<sup>th</sup> – 231<sup>st</sup> Ct.</li> </ul>	Project will eliminate a dangerous and unattractive connection between neighborhood & public access. It will be lit, landscaped and attractively upgraded with a concrete sidewalk and ADA accessibility at each end. It will further encourage pedestrian use to and from retail areas and multi-family neighborhoods.	\$66,575
<b>Public Services – 15% cap - 4 Applications</b>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Fair Housing Project</li> </ul>	Project will provide fair housing services, including outreach, education and enforcement. Services will be provided for low-mod-income tenants and other housing consumers, and to agencies and landlords who provide housing to this targeted group. Services will be coordinated with Legal Aid Services and other local agencies.	\$ 5,952
Human Solutions, Inc		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Transitional Housing Project</li> </ul>	Provides transitional housing for homeless families. Project also provides educational groups with free childcare for low-income East County residents. Supportive services to help families achieve self-sufficiency are also provided.	\$24,220
Catholic Charities/El Programo		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Info &amp; Referral and Emergency Services Project</li> </ul>	Project provides I&R, emergency services and advocacy to low-income Latino population in East Co. Services may include educational and leadership classes, counseling, health services, legal guidance and tax preparation support.	\$ 7,502

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• DIY Small Measure WX &amp; Energy Education Workshops</li> </ul>	Workshops provide energy education and training in low-cost, small- measure WX techniques and free WX materials. This method has documented success in helping reduce or contain energy cost and improved home comfort.	\$ 5,726
