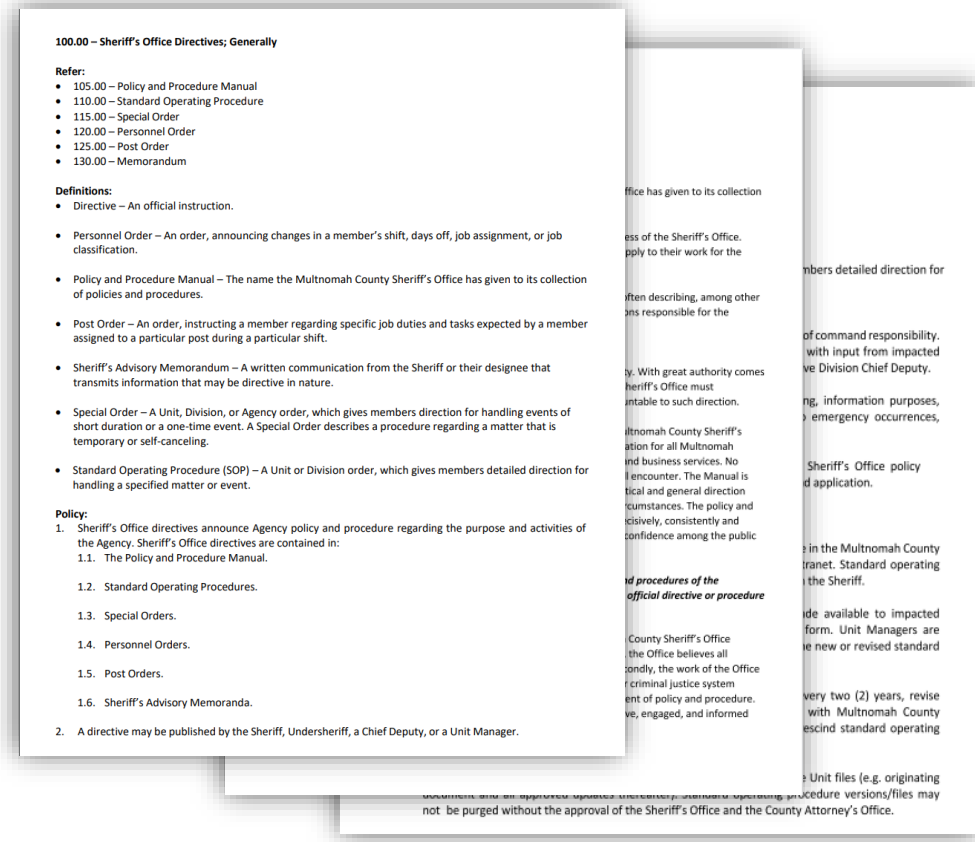


Benefits of Body Worn Cameras

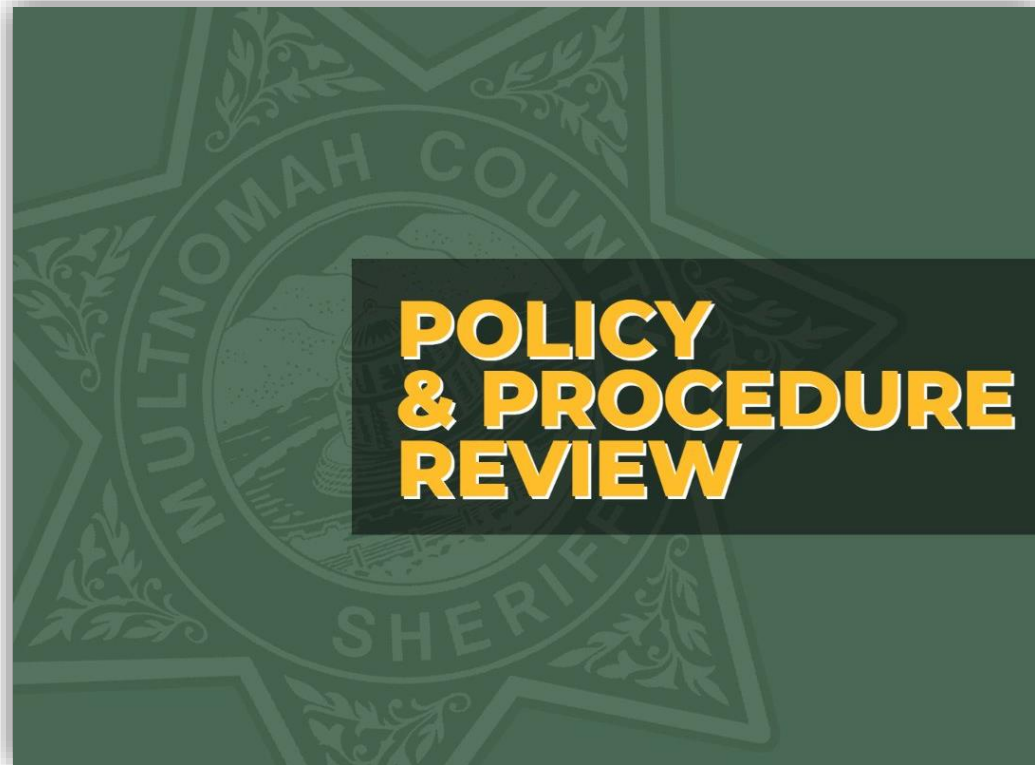
